



Gray Hall Honors Fellow Application

The Honors Residence at Gray Hall, Lloyd International Honors College's residence option for 81 sophomore, junior, and senior Honors students, has as its primary focus the development of Honors students in their pursuit of Disciplinary Honors, undergraduate research, and community engagement. We are pleased to announce a search for five Honors Fellows for the 2015-16 academic year, who will offer co-curricular and extracurricular programming for Honors students residing in Gray Hall. We actively seek a diverse pool of Honors students in good standing who can bring to the position leadership skills, enthusiasm, problem-solving abilities, and excitement about developing new opportunities for Honors students.

Gray Hall Honors Fellows will report to Dr. Muich, the Coordinator of Programming and Academic Adviser for Gray Hall. Fellows must reside in Gray Hall.

Expectations

- ❖ Gray Hall Honors Fellows will be expected to develop, coordinate, and offer programming for students in Gray Hall. Fellows will be expected to put on 2-3 events per semester (or however many 20 hours of work yields). Students are encouraged to both plan on their own and to collaborate with other fellows. Events should aim to address student participation in one or more of the following areas:
 - 1) Service-learning, especially, but not exclusively, with UNCG's Center for New North Carolinians
 - 2) Disciplinary Honors and undergraduate research in the arts and humanities
 - 3) Disciplinary Honors and undergraduate research in the social sciences and business
 - 4) Disciplinary Honors and undergraduate research in the physical sciences and health professions
 - 5) Professional and academic development, with respect to life after UNCG
- ❖ Honors Fellows are expected to assist Dr. Muich and the Honors College during Gray Hall Open House in the Fall and Spring semesters. Fellows may also be requested to assist in other programs as needed, such as Friday Cookies or Reading Day activities.
- ❖ Honors Fellows will maintain a bulletin board on the first floor of the residence.
- ❖ Honors Fellows will attend bi-weekly meetings with Dr. Muich to discuss programming planning progress. Fellows will also meet with Dr. Muich one-on-one for a debriefing session after each of their programs. Finally, Fellows will meet with Dr. Muich one-on-

one at the end of the semester for a reflective discussion of the semester's accomplishments.

To recognize Fellows' work, a stipend of \$500 will be paid in two installments, the first at the end of fall semester, and at the conclusion of the academic year.

Eligibility:

Successful applicants will be sophomores, juniors, or seniors in good standing in the Honors College who elect to reside in Gray Hall. Preference will be given to students who excel academically, and who have served in previous leadership roles while at UNCG, and who have significant volunteer, employment, research, teaching, or internship experience related to the position.

Please type and attach your essay and include it with your application and resume:

In maximum 500 words, please specify which Honors Student Fellow position best fits your experience, accomplishments, and goals. Then describe how your past experience and accomplishments prepare you for this role, keeping in mind that it requires leadership, enthusiasm, problem-solving, and a solutions-oriented mindset. Finally, describe in brief three activities that you would put on for Honors students in Gray Hall and how those activities would improve students' experience of Disciplinary Honors, community engagement, and/or undergraduate research. Please be succinct but detailed in your response. Thank you.

RÉSUMÉ-TO BE ATTACHED AND INCLUDED WITH YOUR APPLICATION FORM

Include with your application and essay a one-page résumé that details relevant coursework, extra-curricular involvement and leadership positions held, research presented at UNCG, regionally, nationally, or internationally, employment related to the position, volunteer work, and internships.

NOTIFICATION TIMELINE

You will be notified by e-mail regarding your application status by Monday, April, 2015. Finalists will be invited to make a 10-minute presentation that outlines their key programming goals. Those interviews will take place during the week of April 20-24, 2015.
